September 1, 1985 - Research & Grants: quarterly deadline for Proposal Writing Workshop and Special Project grants.

December 1, 1985 - Research & Projects Grants: quarterly deadline for Proposal Writing Workshop and Special Project grants; deadline for Travelships for the 22nd Triennial IFUW Conference. International Fellowships: deadline for all applications.

December 15, 1985 - American Fellowships: deadline for Postdoctoral, Dissertation, and Selected Professions (except M.B.A.) fellowships applications.

February 1, 1986 - American Fellowships: deadline for Selected Professions M.B.A. applications. Research & Projects Grants: quarterly deadline for Proposal Writing Workshop and Special Project grants applications; annual deadline for Individual, Project RENEW, Branch/Division Public Service, and Issue Focus grants applications.

June 1, 1986 - Research & Projects Grants: quarterly deadline for Proposal Writing Workshop and Special Project grants applications.


