Marjorie J. Long, Teacher for 29 Years

Marjorie J. Long, 61, a teacher for 29 years and wife of Dr. John B. Long, former executive assistant to County Executive Edward A. Rath,



died Saturday (Dec. 19, 1987) in Buffalo General Hospital after a long illness.

A native of Little Cedar, Iowa, she obtained her teacher's certificate from Iowa State Teachers College in 1944 and

taught elementary school in Northwood and Davenport, Iowa, before moving to the Medina area with her husband.


