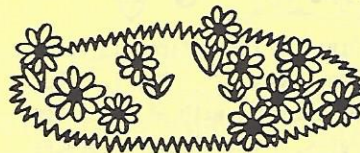

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

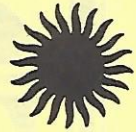

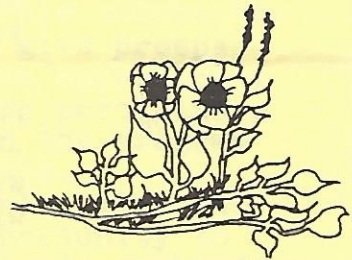
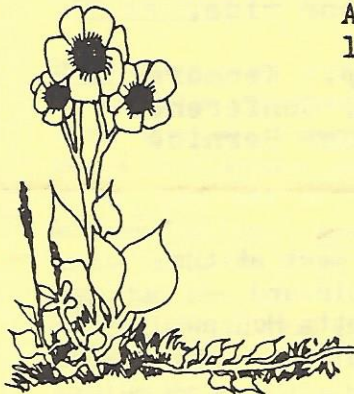
