



#### March Board Meeting

The Buffalo Branch Board of Directors met on March 1, 1995, at the Eggertsville-Snyder Library. The business conducted included the following items:

President Judy Weidemann informed the Board about newsletter editor Betty Loucks' hospitalization and surgical procedure. Everyone wishes her well. Weidemann also encouraged everyone to attend the NY State Convention on Long Island at the end of April. Applications for both state and Association Five Star Branch status were discussed.

Past-President Suzanne Grossman reported that the Equity Conference planned for March 23, 1995, has all its speakers in place. Funding from a local foundation is still being sought. Grossman also reported that the Nominating Committee has a slate prepared for all positions except one. They are still accepting suggestions for this post.

Following President-Elect Bunny
Blackstone's query, a motion was made and
carried to utilize the proceeds from next fall's
auction (being held in conjunction with the pot
luck supper) to benefit both Funds for Education
and our program budget. The percentage for each
will be determined later.

Program Vice-President Carolyn Iadovito stated that the Program Committee will meet again on March 29, 1995, at 5:30pm at Cafe-in-the-Square to finalize program plans for the coming year.

Membership Recruitment Vice-President Marlene Dick was congratulated for her work this year. Two Chamberlin Loan recipients have become members.

Treasurer Lois Meyer circulated the February report, which was explained and filed for audit. Loan Funds Treasurer Cindy Monacelli reported balances of \$26,066.76 in the Chamberlin Fund

and \$6558.45 in the Funds for Education account.

Education and Equity Chair Ann Hicks circulated a catalog of workshops from the Erie-Catt Teacher Center in Orchard Park, which lists for Southtowns educators two activities involving Buffalo Branch: the Equity Conference in March and a Current Issues dinner program with a presentation by former Buffalo president, Barbara Carier, on Sexual Harassment in School.

Community Chair Phyllis Kelly presented a sign-up sheet for those interested in serving as guides for the Junior League's Decorator Showcase.

There was a discussion of the recommendations made by the Finance/Budget Committee last month. A motion not to give donations as mentioned in Recommendation No. 4 was defeated, but a motion that any donations come from the Special Projects Fund if the branch is running a deficit was passed. The remainder of the recommendations were accepted. President Weidemann thanked committee chair Diane Silvestro and her committee members for their work.

Historian Jane Riga is compiling a five-year history of our branch.

May Luncheon chair Alice Mason reported on plans and reminded everyone of the May 20, 1995, luncheon at the Brookfield Country Club.

### NINE STUDENTS RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID FROM BRANCH FUNDS

By the December 10 deadline, dossiers were complete for 14 applicants for assistance from the Chamberlin Loan Fund and/or Funds for Education. Eleven made appointments to be interviewed, and nine were recommended to receive assistance.

The recipients are: Lisa Dalfonso, Lynda Francis, Michelle Goetz, Deborah Graf, Sandra Lindsay, Katherine Netzel, Melissa Newton, Alice Scarpace, and Philip Slaiman. Their awards total \$12,900, of which \$10,900 is from the Chamberlin Loan Fund and \$2,000 is from Funds for Education. Dalfonso, Francis, Goetz, and Graf received awards from Buffalo Branch in previous years. Slaiman is the first male recipient

of a financial award. Lisa Dalfonso received the annual Ruthe Sicherman grant. The awardees are students in several different area colleges and universities--Canisius College, D'Youville College, SUC at Buffalo, and SUNY at Buffalo.
