# President's Message

AAUW's NYS Public Policy statement says that true equity requires a balance between the rights of the individual and the needs of the larger community. AAUW actively works for equity in education for all women and girls. On October 16, 2004, AAUW is sponsoring a conference which will look at gender equity in education and athletics as guaranteed in the 1972 passage of Title IX of the Education Act. The Title IX section of the Education Act prohibits sexual discrimination in Federally Funded schools. AAUW supported the passage of this act in 1972. AAUW's involvment continuted in 1077 when AAUW's Monitoring Title IX was introcuced as an action guide to monitor schools and higher educations institutions in their compliance with Title IX. In 1978, an AAUW Tests Report, But We Will Persist, reveals change without progress. How Schools Shortchange Girls, a 1992 AAUW publication awakened the nation to the gender bias problem.

AAUW members must continue to work for equality in schools. More than thirty years have passed since the passage of Title IX. Many barriers to equality remain. Funding has been cut for Title IX programs. The Women's Educational Equity Act, the only federally funded program focusing on increasing opportunities for women and girls was given NO funding in the 2003 Federal Budget. Come to the Title IX Conference on October 16, 2004, to learn more about this issue. See details elsewhere in this Newsletter.
